Pastor's Message:

“Prepare the Way of the Lord.”

First spoken by the prophet Isaiah, later repeated by the John the Baptist, “Prepare the way of the Lord” summarizes the important work of all the prophets, preparing the people for the coming of Christ. It is also a good description of the season of Advent in the Church, as we prepare for the annual celebration of the incarnation and birth of Christ at Christmas.

The middle Sundays in Advent focus on the John the Baptist, the forerunner of Christ, who prepares the people for Christ's ministry by proclaiming repentance. The season of Advent, historically, is a penitential season in the Church, similar to Lent, in which we fast and pray in sorrow for our sins. In so doing, we rejoice all the more at Christmas and partake of the feast of Christ's birth receiving the forgiveness and salvation that He comes to bring.

**Trinity Lutheran Church Council Meeting
November 4, 2025**

Present: Pastor Hojnacki, Ken Fehr, Mark Liefer, Kathy Nagel, Dean Schoenbeck, Brenda Brewer, Darrell Salger, Cliff Harms, Michael Koester, Danny Salger, Lori Woods and Robin Booth.

Opening: Chairman Ken Fehr called the meeting to order. Pastor led us in prayer.

Principal's Report: Robin presented a check for \$1,510.00 to the church as a percentage of the proceeds from the pork sausage dinner and the rummage sale. Fall Fest will be held this Friday. The Young Christians on Missions held a food drive and collected canned goods to be donated to local food pantries.

Secretary's Report: With no changes or corrections, a motion was made, seconded and moved to accept the secretary's report.

Treasurer's Report: Dean reported that he had to borrow another \$10,000 from Mark & Maureen to pay expenses. So now our loan balance is \$49,115.63 to Dieterick Bank and \$15,024.25 to Liefer's for a total debt of \$64,139.88. According to IEPA & IDPH we are required to do monthly water samples at school. The cost for this is over \$4,000 a year. This seems like an extreme cost when everything has come back fine. Ken will follow up with Eric on this to try to get more information on why we need this done. Warnecke has been paid in full, \$79,587 for the church brick tuck pointing, cleaning, and sealing the brick, chimney repair, and replacing the louvers on the steeple. Mark & Maureen have paid for the steeple louver portion which was \$29,225. CD's earmarked for the church remodel will be used to pay Warnecke. There is currently \$252,310 in church remodel CD's but \$9,011 of this will be used when one of the CD's mature to cover money borrowed to pay the above Warnecke invoice. We have made our mission commitment for the year. A motion was made, seconded and moved to accept the treasurer's report. Dean worked on the salary budget which is to be presented at the annual meeting. After discussion and explanation, a motion was made, seconded and moved to approve the salary ballot to be presented at the annual meeting.

Pastor's Report: Pastor reported we had good attendance, about 175 for both reformation weekend and All Saints Day. In official acts, there were three baptisms, Logan and Miles Murphy and Waylon Schoenbeck. Two funerals, Eunice Miller on Oct. 14 and Darlene Pour on Nov. 3. Adult instruction classes have begun. There will possibly be another class in the spring. Pastor noted that he feels our school has been an outreach which is bringing new families to our school and then the families are interested in joining our church. Pastor attended the Christ Our Savior Board meeting to get an update. The school has not sold yet, a realtor agent has been hired. After the first of the year, we will discontinue paying our monthly mission commitment to COSLHS. There is some cash to be used for monthly expenses that hopefully will last until they are able to sell the property. Pastor has talked to and has received a letter from our new District President, Rev. Heath Curtis. He wants to change things, he is not sending out the normal annual letter asking for our commitment for the Mission Budget. He is asking for our continued support for long time mission projects, but also wants to dedicate funds for local outreach programs within our own congregations, to grow our churches within the district. He has implemented *Come Home for Christmas*, - ads to promote our congregations, *Partners and Practice in the Gospel*, -to bring Ambassadors for Christ team to SID, and *Outreach Mission*



The Christmas Eve Sunday School program and service will be Dec 24th, at 7 pm.



Next Board meeting is Tuesday, Nov 25th at 7 pm.



CHAIR CARTS AVAILABLE

On October 30, Robert and Diane Schoenbeck and Mark Liefer met at COSLHS and picked up 216 metal folding chairs and 3 racks to hang the chairs on. Robert had to modify the racks as they were too tall to fit through the gym storage room doors. Robert cut and shortened the vertical posts, then welded and painted them. Robert, Diane, and Brian Stellhorn then loaded chairs on the modified carts and moved them into the gym storage room.

The Alfred Stellhorn family purchased 200 chairs, and Robert and Diane purchased 16 chairs and 3 racks for holding the chairs. We are very thankful for these donations and the labor to make this all happen. Trinity's original metal folding chairs from about 1960 were sold at the rummage sale or later and are now all gone. Now that all of the old gym chairs have been sold and we have 3 new carts for holding the replacement chairs, we need to sell 2 carts which were used to hold the old chairs. Two of the original four carts have been sold.

Motion seconded and carried.

Mark Liefer has suggested and volunteered to send a letter to the COSLHS association members to consider replacing their mission budget commitment to COSLHS with a mission budget support of Trinity Lutheran School. If they are willing to support in any way, the letter will state that the contributions will go towards paying the salaries of the teachers at our school.

The meeting was adjourned. Pastor led us in the Lord’s Prayer.





Editor's Note (cont.):



Symbols are all around us. Take a look: in church...on your vehicle's dashboard...on road signs...in writing... editing...abbreviations...computer programming (just to name a few). They're everywhere!!

"Behold the Light" was A Christmas Service for The Congregation with Its Children (author: Ann L Meyer & printed by Concordia Publishing House, 1968) that St. John's Lutheran School in Chester presented when I was in 8th grade.

The Christmas program was based on symbols. Symbols that are just as significant for us today as they were for me 57 years ago.

Explanations of the "Behold the Light" symbols (found on page 9 in this issue) are below:

SYMBOL EXPLANATIONS	
Symbol 1	Serpent (devil) would bruise the heel of Christ.
Symbol 2	The earth would be blessed by the cross of Christ.
Symbol 3	Scepter symbolizes that the promised Messiah would be born of Judah.
Symbol 4	God (the triangle) is with us in the Christ (the manger).
Symbol 5	The Messiah is the Prince (crown) of Peace.
Symbol 6	The Bethlehem Star recalls Jesus' birthplace.
Symbol 7	The angel foretold the birth of John.
Symbol 8	Mary knelt as the angel (diamond shape) told her of God's plan.
Symbol 9	The Light (candle) of the world was born in a manger.
Symbol 10	The shepherd's crook recalls the visit of the shepherds.
Symbol 11	Christ (the manger) came to take away our sins by His death. The heart figure reminds us that this Christmastide He wants to dwell in our hearts by faith.

NOTES TO THE LEADER

You may wish to divide the children into 22 groups, assigning older children to prophecy parts and younger children to fulfillment parts.

It is suggested that you seat the older children (Grades 4-8) in the rear of the auditorium or church, placing odd-numbered groups on the left and even-numbered groups on the right. This will lend itself to an antiphonal rendering of each part. The children need only stand to recite. This eliminates traffic problems and improves the worship setting.

It is further suggested that the younger children (Kindergarten-Grade 3) be seated in the front of the auditorium or church. Why? 1. They will be able to see the symbols and actions. 2. They will be heard better by the congregation. 3. By seating the children in this way the congregation is placed in the middle, giving it a feeling of participation. The children in front may simply stand and face the congregation or proceed to a platform on the side, which ever facilitates hearing them the best.

You will need a manger, one large white candle, six purple candles, and six graduated candle holders for this service. Place a large white candle in the manger and place the manger in center front. Put six candles on either side of the manger in their holders. Two acolytes are needed to light and extinguish candles as indicated.

The symbols may be on large placards or with an overhead projector may be projected on a screen placed above but behind the manger.

It should remain uppermost in each person's mind that this is a worship service. To encourage this attitude, you may want to dim the lights so that the focus is on the candles and the symbols rather than on the children. It will help the congregation participate if sufficient copies of the program are ordered so that each person present may have his own.

As was written inside the front cover of this program booklet: The candle...is symbolic of the Light, Christ Jesus. He enters our hearts as the Way of our salvation. The prophecies were light symbols to the Old Testament Jews. This was their hope. When Christ came,



people had the Light itself and no longer based their hope of promises but on fulfillment...Our hope is that having beheld the Light, we now carry the Light forward so that all [people] may see Jesus Christ as Savior and acknowledge Him as Lord.
