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Pastor's Message:

"When these things begin to take place, straighten up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near." (Luke 21:28).

Jesus was teaching His disciples about the End Times, about the events and circumstances that would occur on the earth shortly before His triumphant return at the end of all things. He specifically noted how the signs of His impending return would provoke fear and terror for those who were witnessing them, but that they ought to stand up and eagerly wait for His return when they see these things taking place.

So, which is it supposed to be, fear or anticipation? The answer lies in the dual nature of the judgment that Christ comes to bring. For the wicked and those who have rejected Christ, His return means the end of a comfortable life on earth, the judgment of death and damnation, the justice of punishment for their sins and the consequence of their refusal to seek forgiveness and salvation from Him; certainly reasons to be afraid.

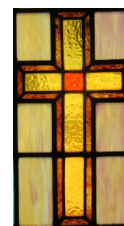

Trinity Lutheran Church Council Meeting
October 7, 2025

Present: Pastor Hojnacki, Ken Fehr, Mark Liefer, Kathy Nagel, Dean Schoenbeck, Larry Erdmann, Darrell Salger, Cliff Harms, Michael Koester, Lori Woods and Robin Booth.

Opening: Chairman Ken Fehr called the meeting to order. Pastor led us in prayer.

Principal's Report: Robin reported that tonight was McDonald's night where a portion of the proceeds would come to Trinity school. A school Glow Dance was enjoyed by the students recently. The Red Bud Fire Department was at the school this week, with a fire drill and seeing the fire truck. Robin thanked the whole congregation from the bottom of her heart, especially the church ladies and men doing the frying and for all the help, plus desserts, for the Sausage Dinner on Sunday. She said they could not have done it without all that help. At this time the gross amount was \$6,000.

Secretary's Report: The report was sent out to the board. With no changes a motion was made, seconded and moved to accept the secretary's report.

Treasurer's Report: Dean reported that the giving was down again this month and he had to borrow the remaining \$15,000 of our Dieterich Bank line of credit. He also had to borrow another \$5,000 from Mark & Maureen Liefer to cover expenses. So, our current loan balance is \$54,164.30. No out of the ordinary expenses, just salaries and utilities are higher and income was less. Mission giving was good this month and we have exceeded our commitment for the year. Warnecke Building has finished the church work. It consisted of taking down the chimney to the roof level and sealing it off, tuckpointing, cleaning, water proofing and replacing the louvers on the bell tower. The total cost was \$79,587. Mark & Maureen have graciously paid all repairs to the bell tower at a cost of \$29,225. The remaining cost of \$50,362 will be paid out of money reserved for the church remodel project. A motion was made, seconded and moved to accept the treasurer's report.

Pastor's Report: Pastor reported that church attendance in September was good with more than 125 per weekend. Adult classes are starting with 3 currently attending, possibly a couple more. 3 baptisms coming up. No official acts in September. One membership, a transfer out, Christine Buch to St. John's Red Bud. The synod convention delegates elected from our circuit are Rev. Lyle Buettner from New Athens and Larry Erdmann from Trinity to attend the LCMS Convention which will be held in 2026. Special services coming up will be reformation on Oct 25 and 26, both services with communion. All Saints Day will be observed November 2. The youth confirmation classes have begun on Sunday evening with 9 students. Discussion was made at the last pastor conference in regards to gluten free communion wafers, since it is not bread, there may be some theological issues with it. So, it was decided to put a hold on using that for the moment.

Elder's Report: The church computer will need to be replaced soon. This computer is used to record, edit, and put our services on YouTube and for WHCO.

Trustee's Report: Mark reported that while Warnecke was here they noted another issue. There are 7 sections of glass windows on the church steeple, 3rd level down, on each side, with a tempered glass covering the whole window. These should be taken down and all the frames

need to be cleaned, primed, and painted and then all the windows need to be puttied. Mark is checking on a bid for this, and he and Maureen have again offered to pay for this. Mark mentioned that Warnecke complimented on how well we have maintained our church!

The first water sample has come back good. Also, it was noted that Pest Control will be contacted to spray for spiders.

A motion was made to adjourn. Pastor led us in the Lord's Prayer.

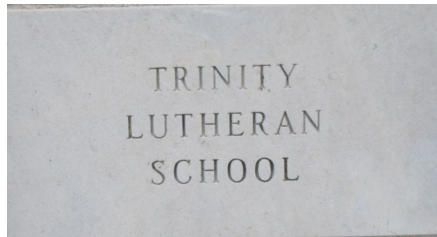

Administrator's report: Dr Booth attended a meeting at SWIC in regards to the year long celebration and recognition of Red Bud School Districts 250th anniversary. The schools will be included in an essay contest and there are several different activities and events being planned for the community.

MAPS testing went well. The students were more recently tested at the beginning of the 2025-26 school year. Trinity students tested in the 70th percentile for Math and 60th for Reading, the 85th percentile for Language Arts and in 5-8th grade, they tested in 93rd percentile in Science. This Friday, Sept 26th will be the school GLOW dance. The pork sausage dinner will be Sunday Oct. 5th. Farther out, Dr Booth has booked Bob the Animal presenter to come to Trinity Jan 28th.

Oct 7th will be McTeachers for Trinity from 4-8.

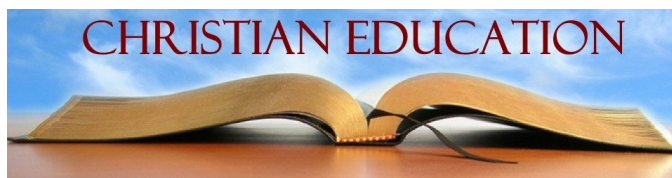
The fire drill with our Red Bud Fire Department will be Monday Oct 6th.

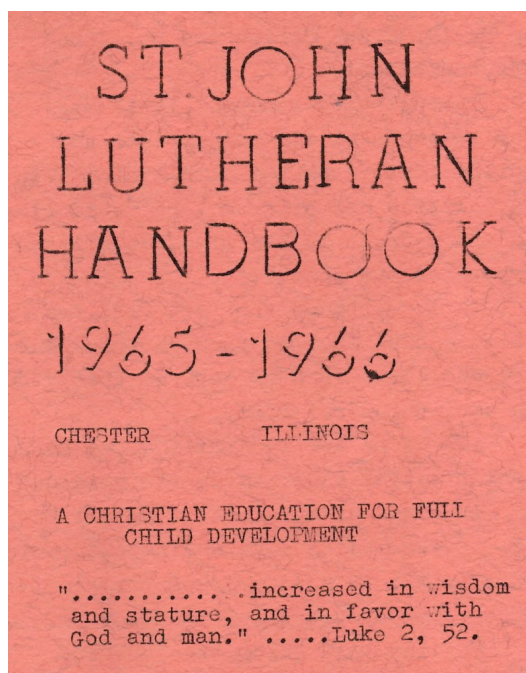

Mrs. Edwin Erdman was the head cook at St. John...her food was SOOOO good (salmon croquettes were the best...yum). The old handbook addressed St. John's CAFETERIA in one section: "Hot lunches will again be available



every noon to the pupils from grades one through eight. The lunches are well-planned and meet the requirements of the government. Cost: Grades 1,2,3—25 cents (\$1.25 weekly); Grades 4-8—30 cents (\$1.50 weekly)...An extra half pint of milk for the afternoon recess may be purchased for 2 cents per bottle...The boys and girls in the eighth grade have an opportunity to work in the cafeteria and thus earn free meals...You are welcome to visit the cafeteria. Encourage your child to eat the food prepared for him." Good memories! Let us give thanks to God for our many, many blessings on November 27 and every day!

Trinity Church Exterior With Thanks!

Warnecke finished the job on October 2, 2025.

Tuck pointing finished. Warnecke workers try very hard to match the color of the existing mortar between the bricks. Looking up at the bricks, the tuck pointed mortar is nearly indistinguishable from the older, existing mortar! Bricks washed & sealed.

The louver replacements went remarkably well...Warnecke measured the old louvers & fabricated the new ones in their shop...no problems at all (perfect fit). They even added some additional bracing on the inside.

The workers noticed that our church sign had a lot of mold so they cleaned the sign & sealed that brick, too!!

Maureen offered to show Kyle Turner the inside of church and point out a few of the areas of past concern. Clint Kapp, who had been inside before, crawled up into the bell tower...said all looked good. Informed Clint & Kyle that our congregation intends to have work done on the inside of the church next summer. They agreed 100% that the exterior needed to be repaired BEFORE doing any work on the interior. Clint & Kyle were very complimentary of our church's preventative maintenance...that it is great to see Trinity addressing issues BEFORE problems get too far gone. They see many churches that have not been maintained and then congregations are shocked at the amount of work and money it takes to "restore" the structure!!
